CHIEF DAN FLYNN Marietta Police Department Topic: "Innovative Initiatives to Fight Opioid Abuse"



Today's Speaker: Chief Dan Flynn

Dan is currently the Chief of Police with the Marietta Police Department. He was appointed on January 15, 2007. He has enjoyed a 46-year career in law enforcement rising to the rank of Major with the Miami-Dade Police Department where he served as District Commander. After Miami-Dade, he served as Chief of the Savannah Police Department and ultimately, Chief of the 800 members Savannah-Chatham Metropolitan Police Department.

He holds Bachelors and Masters Degrees in Public Administration as well as post-graduate certificates from the University of Miami and George Washington University and is a graduate of the FBI National Academy and Senior Management Institute for Police. Dan has authored several law enforcement publications for the International Association of Chiefs of Police, Police Executive Research Forum and Community Policing Consortium. He served as a consultant to numerous law enforcement agencies and worked in homeland security planning, assessments, and training. He served as a consultant to multiple law enforcement agencies and worked in homeland security planning, assessments, and training associated with Critical Incident Solutions organization.

In 2017 Dan was named Chief of the Year by the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police.

The goal this year is to clear over \$100,000. In the news: once again our very own **Dan Kirk** had another of his articles published in the MDJ. **Neera Bahl** was sworn in as a member of the Cobb County Board of Elections. Congrats Dan and Neera!

There was plenty of sunshine at the Marietta Hilton as **Walt Walker** announced that **Fred Beloin** now has a granddaughter AND a grandson! **Lee Pence** threw sunshine to Hedwig "Hedy" James. She is a native of Switzerland and after WWII came to the United States and became a productive citizen. Neera gave sunshine for her mother who has congestive heart failure, and was able to come home from the hospital on Tuesday.

Newly minted Grandpa twice over, Fred Beloin rose to introduce today's speaker Dr. J. C. Bradbury. J. C. graduated from Marietta High School and worked at the MDJ. Currently he is an economist at Kennesaw State University. He is also a huge fan of the great game of baseball and jokingly titled his presentation "An Economist Ruins Baseball". Play Ball!

As a person who attends a major league baseball game 2-3 times per year, this scribe thinks that the game is only part of the entire experience. We're there to chat with friends, sit outside, perhaps with a cold adult beverage and a bag of popcorn. The Home Depot Tool Race is the highlight of the game and the seventh inning stretch is tradition. Oh yeah...and there's a baseball game going on in case you didn't know.... Our speaker today believes that statistics will help us better understand the game of baseball. Statistics? I took that course in college and the professor never mentioned baseball! Nor did he mention Sabermetrics, which apparently is very important to baseball. Our speaker gave us some great examples of Sabermetrics, and I'm hoping that these minutes help to de-mystify this subject for you.

So, let's discuss Batting Averages. Currently in the National League the Pittsburgh Pirates have the highest batting average, (the Braves are 4th), but in the rankings, the Pirates are in 10th place, (our Braves are in 3rd place). This statistic needs a little help from other statistics though, (ie. On Base Percentage and Slugging Percentage), as a meaningful way to rate hitters. Then there is the OPS (On-Base plus Slugging) stat, which is the ability of a player both to get on base and hit for power. So, if we rated a team using OPS, the current NL leaders for highest runs per game are the Los Angeles Dodgers, (the Braves are in 2nd place). Confusing, right? Read on!

Earned Running Average is the way most of us rate pitchers. The lower the ERA, the better. There are many caveats as to how to calculate ERA such as the pitcher must pitch at least 5 innings and his team must be leading at the end. So since ERA is a measure of how many runs are given up per 9 innings pitched, 70% of results are due to the players behind the pitcher. A better way to assess the ability of a pitcher is to use Defense Dependent Pitching. Examples are the strike out to walk ratio and home runs allowed per 9 innings pitched.

Finally, the Fielders can be assessed by using the Defensive Runs Saved statistic which is the number of runs saved or given up relative to the average player.

With that, our speaker asked for questions and apologized for ruining baseball. There were several great questions "fielded" by the audience such as:

How can baseball speed up the game? Dr. Bradbury responded by saying that they have cut off about 10 minutes of playing time, per game. Much more time could be saved by disallowing team members to hold conferences on the pitching mound. He also stated that most attendees really don't care about how long the game goes.

What about Wins Above Replacement? Dr. Bradbury said that most players' numbers are negative.

What about exit velocity, a measure of how fast the ball comes off the bat and launch angle? Dr. Bradbury said that this stat is getting better because of better ball technology, allowing hitters to hit the ball farther. One theory is that new ball design uses thicker laces, resulting in a more spherically symmetric ball which "could" have the unintended side effect of reducing the ball's drag. (Thank you, Google!)

Why are owners' revenues going up faster than the players' salaries? Owners have other outlets such as social media to exploit and create more wealth opportunities than do the players.

What is baseball doing to protect the fans? Our speaker said that many ball parks have pushed seats closer and closer to the

action and the league is finally coming around to requiring extra netting on the field.

Dr. Bradbury ended his comments by saying that the jury is still out on some of these statistics.

President Chris stood up to thank our speaker and donate a book to a local school in his honor. The book du jour was Wonky Donkey.

The Opportunity Drawing was administered by **Jim Kellogg** and PE **Mary Ansley Southerland**. **Morgan McNeel** drew the first ball, but struck out. Next up was Carlos Rodriguez, last week's Opportunity Drawing winner, but he was unable to repeat his performance.

Daniel White led us in the Pledge of Allegiance and the 4 Way Test. President Chris rang the bell and called this meeting a grand slam home run!

President Chris had a few parting comments: Please come next week to see our very own Rotary Club member and the Chief of Marietta's Finest, **Dan Flynn**. Chief Flynn will enlighten us about the Opioid Epidemic.
