PURPOSE: The District Governor's Citation recognizes outstanding achievements and passion of Rotary District 6900 clubs and their members. Rotary International President Holger and DG Kirk wish to challenge each club to "<u>OPEN New OPPORTUNITIES" with their Members, their</u> <u>Community and the World Through Fellowship and Service"</u> in Rotary Year 2020-21.

<u>MANDATORY Governor's Citation Requirements:</u> Listed below are mandatory items your club must achieve to qualify for the Governor's Citation. <u>All 10 Mandatory items listed below must be completed.</u> Each item is valued at 100 points.

- 2. Rotary Clubs will verify strategic planning goals are in place for next 5 years (Items 20 & Basic Club Admin)
- 3. Update Club Officer/Director Positions in <u>MyRotary.Org</u> no later 10/01/2020. (Items 2, 5, 21 & Basic Club Admin)

D6900 Governor's Citation 2020-21 Continued

The 2020-2021 Governor's Citation is simple as DG Kirk wishes to maintain RI President Holger's award recognition program. Simply follow the criteria requirements and attached for the RI Citation awards as they are the same for D6900. Reflecting RI, the intent of this document is to provide a quick understanding of how to qualify for the District 6900 Governor's Citation in 2020-21.

Here are the important things to know:

- Fulfill the achievement criteria identified for each of your 15 Club goals per RCC. <u>You may</u> use the attached 25 RCC Goal Categories for club planning purposes until Clubs populates the 2020-2021 RCC Goal Categories with the Goal Center.
- To qualify for the Governor's Citation, each club must achieve **15 of 25 Club RCC Goal Categories**. Your club selects the goals and your target level of achievement in each.
- Achievements in each category must be entered and updated by the club in Rotary Club Central, except for Membership, Annual Fund and PolioPlus contributions which will be updated from Rotary.org data/reports.
- Set a goal in a minimum of 15 categories. All goal accomplishments will be verified through RCC, RI and District reports. Points assigned by each goal will be utilized to identify "D6900 Club of the Year and Runner Up Club of the Year."
- Enter your club's accomplishments in Rotary Club Central by **March 1**st, **2021**. When you've achieved your goals in at least 15 categories you qualify for the Citation and your points for Governor Citation will be assessed. Governor Citation and Service Project points will be used to determine "**Club of the Year and Runner Up Club of the Year.**"
- **Important**: Be aware of any Membership achievement, your Club's membership must be achievable prior to June 30, 2021. Late terminations may not allow your club to qualify for the RI Club Citation or Governor's Citation awards.

----- Goal Entry Process -----

1. Start at Rotary.org

2. Log in. If you're unable to log in, you may need to Create an Account in My Rotary - use the **"REGISTER FOR AN ACCOUNT**" button (if you do not already have a Rotary.org/MyRotary.Org or RCC.org account), follow the prompts and watch for a confirming email.

3. Click on Rotray Club Central. Once in RCC, Click Goal Center on the left navigator:

4. Change the year at the top to 2020-21. You may need to click the "All" tab on the right. An editable list of all 25 available Goal Categories will open.

5. Check the Select Goal box for those you intend to pursue. Remember - you can choose as many Categories as you wish, of which you must achieve 15.

6. Note the **"Show goal details and history**" link - that provides data for prior years. This may be helpful in arriving at realistic and achievable goals for 2020-2021.

7. You do not have to enter all goals at once-take your time, "SAVE" before exiting.

- 8. Enter ALL Club achievements at any time prior to March 1, 2021.

D6900 Governor's Citation 2020-21 Goal Categories

In most goal categories, the goal is a **quantity** to be achieved, comparing actual accomplishments to goals.

1. Club membership - How many total members does your club want by the end of the Rotary year?

2. <u>Service participation</u> - How many members will participate in club service activities during the Rotary year?

3. <u>New member sponsorship</u> - How many members will sponsor a new club member during the Rotary year?

4. <u>Rotarian Action Group participation</u> - How many club members will join at least one Rotarian Action Group (RAG) during the Rotary year?

5. <u>Leadership development participation</u> - How many members will participate in leadership RI/District leadership development programs or activities during the Rotary year?

6. District conference attendance - How many members will attend your district conference?

7. <u>Rotary Fellowship participation</u> - How many club members will be members of a Rotary Fellowship during the Rotary year?

8. <u>District training participation</u> - How many of your club's committee chairs or their designated representatives will attend the district training assembly?

9. <u>Annual Fund contributions</u> - How much money will be contributed to The Rotary Foundation Annual Fund by your club and its members during the Rotary year?

10. **PolioPlus Fund contributions** - How much money will be contributed to The Rotary Foundation PolioPlus Fund by your club and its members during the Rotary year?

11. <u>Major gifts</u> - How many single outright donations of US \$10,000 or more will be made by individuals associated with your club during the Rotary year?

12. <u>Bequest Society members</u> - During the Rotary year, how many individuals will identify to The Rotary Foundation of their plans to leave US\$10,000 or more to The Rotary Foundation through their estate?

13. <u>Benefactors</u> - During the Rotary year, how many individuals will inform The Rotary Foundation of their estate plans to include the Endowment Fund as a beneficiary or will make an outright gift of US\$1,000 or more?

14. <u>Service projects</u> - How many service projects will your club complete during the Rotary year? To track and report project details, such as contributions and volunteer hours, select Service Activities in the main menu.

15. <u>Rotaract clubs</u> - How many new and existing Rotaract clubs will your club sponsor/co-sponsor during the Rotary year?

16. <u>Interact clubs</u> - How many new and existing Interact clubs will your club sponsor/co-sponsor during the Rotary year?

17. <u>Inbound Youth Exchange students</u> - How many inbound Rotary Youth Exchange students will your club sponsor/co-sponsor during the Rotary year?

18. <u>Outbound Youth Exchange students</u> - How many outbound Rotary Youth Exchange students will your club sponsor during the Rotary year?

19. <u>**RYLA participation**</u> - How many individuals will your club sponsor/co-sponsor in Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) events during the Rotary year?

20. Strategic plan - Does your club have an up-to-date strategic plan? (Yes/No)

21. **Online presence** - Does your club's online presence accurately reflect its current activities? (Yes/No)

22. <u>Social activities</u> - How many social activities will your club hold outside of regular meetings during the Rotary year?

23. <u>Update website and social media</u> - During the Rotary year, how many times per month will your club's website or social media accounts be updated?

24. <u>Media stories about club projects</u> - How many media stories will cover your club's projects during the Rotary year?

25. <u>Use of official Rotary promotional materials</u> - Did your club use Rotary International's advertising and public service materials, such as broadcast videos, print ads, and other official materials available in the Brand Center, to promote Rotary in your community during the Rotary year? (Yes/No)
