Stikes

Brittany Stikes, Executive Director of the Griffin Spalding Historical Society (GSHS), explained to those attending Thursday's program that GSHS is committed to preserving and sharing the history of Griffin and Spalding County and to promoting the preservation and use of historic places in our community. The Society was founded in 1969 and was headquartered in the Lewis-Mills House at 406 North Hill Street from 1970 until 1987 when the headquarters moved to the Bailey-Tebault House on Meriwether Street where it still resides. Stikes invited everyone out to Bailey-Tebault to see the recent renovations, especially those in the upstairs areas. Both of those homes are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. She said that in her role with GSHS she often answers questions from those studying genealogy or just interested in history. She also connects those individuals with archivists and historians. GSHS relies on partnerships to accomplish their goals and overall mission. These include the City of Griffin, Spalding

County, the Georgia Land Bank, the Georgia Trust, investors, preservationists, local businesses, and members of the Society. She explained that the Haisten House is a historic structure that GSHS has focused on restoring the exterior with the hopes of hoping to sell it to a preservationist investor. Even with these efforts, the structure is still in danger of not being salvaged for preservation. The Society gives to the community in several ways. In addition to assisting with restoring and preserving historic sites, GSHS offers educational events to teach the importance of preservation, and they encourage the use of historic facilities in various ways. She said that all could become involved in preserving this community's history by donating to their revolving fund, becoming a member of GSHS, volunteering to assist with events, and join as a corporate sponsor.
