## THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM Wellstar Spalding Regional

In keeping with this month's Rotary Theme of Disease Prevention and Treatment, Tamara Ison, Senior VP and President of Wellstar Spalding Regional Hospital and Sylvan Grove Hospital, updated Rotarians and guests on recent changes and current challenges for the Spalding Regional Hospital. Consolidations among healthcare facilities and even among health insurance companies are efforts to improve efficiency and accessibility to quality facilities and care. The local Spalding Regional Hospital was part of Wellstar's recent consolidation of several facilities to grow from 5 hospitals to 11. Ison feels that Wellstar is addressing the needs of our local community with its formula for shifting volume to value care. She cited several health statistics to underscore the challenges facing Wellstar locally. Spalding ranks 134<sup>th</sup> of 159 counties in the Georgia

County Health Rankings. The leading cause of death in the County is heart disease with a significant proportion of the total population uninsured (20%). Obesity, hypertension, and diabetes are common maladies, and 19% of the adult population smokes. Almost 40% of those patients in the Emergency Department (ED) are uninsured, and 75% of admissions come through ED. Increasing costs of healthcare, the aging of our population, and the high level of regulation of healthcare add to these local challenges. Wellstar's multi-faceted approach to addressing these challenges includes assessments and re-investing into new facilities and technologies. "Our goal is to provide every patient with access to world-class healthcare which is providing the right care at the right place at the right time," Ison said. Wellstar has already invested \$6 million locally to add new facilities, improve existing facilities, and add a new MRI, an additional CT, a 3-D Mammography device, and more. A Physician's Workforce Planning survey has been conducted with the report scheduled to be released in January. This will define specific physician needs in the area served by Spalding Regional. A hospital-sponsored or hospital-based Graduate Medical Education program is being considered, and "health parks" are being explored involving primary care, urgent care, imaging, and rehabilitation in stand-alone buildings separate from the hospital.
