Georgia Sports Hall of Fame

Could Charles Jones have picked a better date for a program on the Georgia Sports Hall of Fame (GSHOF)? After all, the high-soaring Falcons just demolished the Packers in the NFC Championship Game in the Dome last Sunday! Maybe a better date might have been February 9 after the Falcons win Super Bowl LI. But, the Rotary audience enjoyed Derek Waugh's (GSHOF President and CEO) presentation with sports-related jokes, sports trivia, and plenty of facts about our Sports Hall of Fame. Waugh invited all to the Class of 2017 Induction Ceremony to be held on February 25th at the Historic Macon City Auditorium. Among those honored this year is Griffin-native Willie Gault, a former worldclass sprinter and All-Pro NFL receiver. Gault joins four other native Griffinites - Rayfield Wright (football), Jesse Tuggle (football), Wyomia Tyus (track), and Margaret Wilbur (track) - in the Georgia Sports Hall of Fame. Waugh listed other individuals

so honored, including Sugar Ray Leonard, Jackie Robinson, Ty Cobb, Bobby Jones, and more. But, he quickly added that the GSHOF is more than just a venue for recognizing achievement. "We also promote competitive sports," he said. GSHOF uses the acronym F-L-A-M-E as a basis in its recognitions and in its promotions. Waugh explained that FLAME means F for Fellowship, L for Leadership, A for Accountability, M for Mental Toughness, and E for Effort. The GSHOF was founded in 1956 as one of the oldest state sports HOFs. The first class was inducted in 1963 with Ty Cobb, Bobby Jones, and William Alexander as the honorees. In the 1970's, the state took official control of the GSHOF, and its current facility was constructed in Macon during the 1990's. "We are the largest and the oldest state hall of fame," Waugh added. The criteria for selection to the GSHOF are simply stated as making significant achievements in sports and either being born in Georgia, having moved to Georgia to make those impacts, or making significant impacts to Georgia athletics. Past inductees include teams, players, coaches, legends, sportswriters, sportscasters, and more. Waugh was obviously impressed that his audience



very capably answered several Georgia sports trivia questions He was also he posed. impressed with the trivia questions posed to him by several audience members. Waugh ended his presentation with a short video on sports in Georgia and the Georgia Sports Hall of Fame. The GSHOF is a 41,000 sq ft state-of-the-art museum with over 3,000 artifacts located in Macon. It offers tours, rentals of facilities, and even a Locker Room Gift Store of souvenirs.
