## THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM The Center for the Visually Impaired

Ben Coleman, Director of Program Marketing for the Atlanta-based Center for the Visually Impaired, explained how this "grass-roots" organization created by parents of visually-impaired children as a support group in 1962 has now grown to provide a diversity of services to all age groups. "It is a small nonprofit," Coleman said. "That makes marketing a challenge." The Center currently serves about 4,000 clients of all ages each year. Fifty-four percent of those are from low-income households. The Center's mission is in 'empowering' individuals with little to no vision enabling them to function as independently as possible (functional limitations). They do so through techniques, education, and use of devices. Until recently, the Center restricted its work to Atlanta. But, now they are reaching out to serve clients within an approximately one hour drive from Atlanta. He noted that they now work in partnership with the local

Takle Eye Center in offering rehabilitative and assessment services through that office once or twice a month. Clients typically have less than 20/60 vision with functional limitations including conditions resulting from glaucoma, maculation degeneration, or diabetes. Clients range from infants, blind preschoolers, visually-impaired high school age, working age adults, and senior citizens. Services are individualized based upon needs. Center personnel offer nonmedical therapy (much the same as physical therapy), with programs involving newborns (only one in the state), music therapy, classroom activities, after-school activities, weekend and summer camps, and educational resources dealing with diabetes, orientation and mobility, technology skills, and more. "We want our clients to be independent and to succeed," Coleman added. Coleman encouraged audience members to "connect with us" by going to their website (www.cviga.org) to Learn about the Center and its programs, to Volunteer to assist with educational activities and other events, to Refer others in need of assistance to the Center and the website, and to Donate to assist with the mission of the Center.
