Ag Commissioner Gary Black

Gary Black, Commissioner of the Georgia Department of Agriculture, was our program speaker on Thursday. After introductions by Steve Crouch, Black acknowledged that attending meetings of this type are a favorite part of his job. "I get to speak with community leaders and continue to build relationships," he said. Black obviously loves the work involved in leading our Department of Agriculture. "This is a great opportunity to serve people," he added. "Thanks to each of you for allowing me to do this job." He iterated that the number one industry in Georgia remains as agriculture. He noted that most citizens living in Griffin and the surrounding area appreciate the impact that agriculture has on the state's economy. He specifically

cited the programs, faculty, staff, and facilities of the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences on the local UGA Griffin Campus. That Campus also houses an administrative group of the Department's Plant Protection Division. The Department administers a variety of programs, all of which are focused on maintaining the viability of the state's agricultural industries while protecting consumers. Black sees that Georgia Agriculture has some unique opportunities to expand its economic impact. To that end, Black is insuring that the Department has the very best talent in servicing the industry and our consumers. He added that Georgia must be the top state in which to do business and that we must be the number one place where local food business flourishes. The Department must help citizens start new businesses and work to insure those and other businesses remain in business. "We must educate as we regulate," he said. Black also cited that the Department will continue its effort in preparing the state in responding to natural disaster and marketing Georgia Grown and Georgia Sown products. He concluded by underscoring that Agriculture makes life better in Georgia.

President Tom Gardner presented Louisa Melton of the local chapter of the Ferst Foundation with a donation of \$540.00 in support of their activities in our local community to enhance literacy. The Program provides for age-Ferst appropriate books to be mailed to the homes of participating children each month. The Spalding County chapter is currently providing for books to be sent to the homes of 800 local children. That number is limited by the finances the local chapter obtains each year. Melton thanked the Club for its continuing support saying, "You were one of our first organization to support us as we started 4 years ago." Since then, over 42,000 books have been sent to children in our community.
