Griffin Rotarians Jim King and Philip Smith, two highly decorated U.S. Army veterans of the Vietnam War era, presented a Veteran's Day program honoring the veterans in our Club. Philip explained that he and Jim had personally interviewed each of the veterans honored and found a common theme among all interviewed. Each veteran had proudly served and, after being discharged, returned to civilian life, locked away the horrors and unpleasant memories of their military service, continued being patriotic citizens, and contributed to their community in their businesses and as Rotarians. With a backdrop of pictures of our honored veterans, Jim and Philip shared a few comments about each and his/her service. All are listed below.
