Orla McDevitt 2017-18 GRSP Student Edinburgh, Scotland Orla McDevitt, our 2017-18 GRSP Student, bade farewell to Club members on Thursday as she ended her year at the University of Georgia. Orla admitted that she was very apprehensive about the GRSP experience when she landed in Georgia last July 22<sup>nd</sup>, just a few days after her 18<sup>th</sup> birthday. She immediately saw there were a number of differences between the U.S. and her native Edinburgh, Scotland - one being that although both countries speak English, the accents and phrases make them sound totally different. But, Orla found that she adapted quite well and even uses "y'all" frequently. She shared that the UGA experience "was amazing." She found the campus to be beautiful, Saturdays during football season exciting, and the courses and friendships among her best life experiences. She added that the GRSP experience was even more amazing. The GRSP weekends allowed the 45 students to see and experience different parts of Georgia and, more importantly, make new friends representing 14 different countries. "We all shared our own traditions," she said. "We became a family." They enjoyed Music Mid-Town Festival, St. Patrick's Day in Savannah, G-Day in Athens, and a day at Six Flags. Orla also traveled with a smaller group of friends for weekend or holiday excursions to New York City, Chicago, and Miami. They visited Mexico over New Years, and Washington, DC over Easter. And, she will visit with family in San Francisco before returning to Scotland later this month. As she reflected on her entire GRSP experience, she said that it helped her broaden her horizons, immersed her into American culture (which she enjoyed), and taught her much in her travels with GRSP friends. She loved sharing her Scottish traditions with her new friends. She taught others Scottish dances and Scottish songs. "The experience also made me appreciate my home," she added. Orla thanked her host family (Wade, Jill, Jack, and Josh Miller) for their care and support. "This was the first time I could be a big sister," she said. She also thanked the Club for supporting her. "GRSP really does change lives," she added. "When I return, I will become more involved in Rotaract and Rotary and encourage others to apply for this wonderful program."
