# **Griffin Rotary Welcomes New Teachers to Community**

Griffin Rotarians welcomed approximately 150 enthusiastic new teachers to the Griffin-Spalding School System at Thursday's meeting. With a show of hands, it was evident that the majority of our new teachers are not new to the profession but have chosen to move to our system. After welcoming remarks by Club VP Tom Gardner, Steve Mulder, and Partners in Education Board Chair Jeff Jordan, Brett Bell introduced our speaker, Mr. Syntel Brown. Mr. Brown is a native Griffinite and a 2004 graduate of Griffin High School. He is currently teaching high school history in East Point and is the new Member-Elect of our local Board of Education. Brown shared some words of encouragement and motivation, borrowing from his own classroom experience and those of his family of educators, including his mother and aunts. He spoke directly to the new teachers saying, "I remember my first year as a teacher. It was a tough, tough time." He listed all that one must learn in that first year, but he quickly added that he is an enthusiastic educator. Brown said that a teacher is a builder, a creator, a nurturer, a caregiver, a disciplinarian, an inspirer, a motivator, and more. "We must find the potential in each of our students," he said. "We must use all the resources we have to help them reach that potential. And, we must give them the tools they need to succeed beyond our classrooms." Syntel shared a list of points from his mother, Retha Brown, that have help him in his own growth and development as an educator. First, relax, be in control, but be prepared to be flexible. Second, college courses will not prepare you for each and every day in the classroom. Three, as a teacher, you are a student, too. Four, learn from everyone around you including fellow teachers, administrators, and even students. Five, it's okay to have fun. Six, be kind and be courteous to all others. Seven, classroom management is important, and you must remember to be tough at first and then ease up later. You cannot do the reverse. And, finally, leave room for your personal life. Brown concluded with a quote, "Students don't care how much you know until they know how much you care." His words resonated not only with the teachers but also will all in attendance, and he received a standing ovation as he ended his presentation.
