# **ADVENTURES AT HISTORIC BANNING MILLS**

Cynthia Cole of American Adventure Parks spoke of the number of outdoor adventures offered at Historic Banning Mills located adjacent to Hwy 16 in Carroll County. The facility offers a variety of accommodations and adventures including lodging, hiking trails, spa and massage packages, an adventure camp for kids, a climbing wall, a power freefall, kayaking, horseback riding, and more. The Guinness Book of World Records lists the zipline canopy course as the longest continuous one in the world, and the climbing wall is the tallest in the world. Cole noted that American Adventure Parks is totally committed to safety in their adventure offerings. Their ziplines and other adventures are operating at a number of locations throughout the U.S., including the ziplines at Amicalola Falls State Park and Unicoi State Park here in Georgia. The zipline at Historic Banning Mills is over 10 miles long and is an amazing flight that takes zipliners over many pristine areas including the Snake Creek gorge. The 1500-acre facility in Carroll County was initially a 20acre homesite for Mike and Donna Holder who purchased the land and cabin in 1997. The adventure park with its spacious lodge and several individual cabins now occupies 300 acres. The remaining acreage is in a conservancy for local wild flora and fauna. The area was originally inhabited by indigenous people of the Creek and Cherokee tribes. Even Chief McIntosh lived there. And, many Indian artifacts continue to be found in the creek and in the area. The Banning mills date back to pre-Civil War. Their ruins remain there. Cole invited all to visit their website at www.historicbanningmills.com to see all their offerings and to consider scheduling team building activities or business events there.
